Program Outcomes

Outcomes

Overall successful completion year to year is 90% or above

93% of clients successfully completed the program in 2021

Overall daily participant numbers (census) are trending up, bringing daily cost down

Average Daily Cost of Men's program was \$71.51, a decrease of 13% from 2021

Overall 75% of clients who successfully completed were ***not incarcerated*** again in the following 12 months

24% of clients who successfully completed the program experienced incarceration in the 12 months following

Program Outcomes

Ongoing Treatment

Clients are connecting to CRC for treatment

85% of Men connecting to treatment, remained in treatment at 90 days

87% of Women connecting to treatment, remained in treatment at 90 days

81% of Men connecting to MAT, remained in MAT services at 90 days

84% of Women connecting to MAT, remained in MAT services at 90 days

Employment Services

Overall 72% of Men and 63% of Women have employment at admission

All clients in the program participate in employment readiness and job retention programming

Overall, 54% of clients interested in obtaining employment, engaged with the ASPIRE Employment Program

Overall 33 clients were assisted in finding employment through the ASPIRE Employment Program

Men averaged working 38hrs per week and earned on average \$14.91 per hour

Women averaged working 37hrs per week and earned an average of \$13.65 per hour

Jobs obtained involved 40 different employers with 27 different job titles

Program Highlights

COVID Response

- ▶ Supplemental and Recovery Supports returned in-person to CASC
- ▶ Vaccines available to all staff and clients
- ▶ Continued enhanced cleaning protocols, unit assessment
- ▶ Mask wearing, social distancing, symptom screening all staff and clients
- ▶ Collaboration with Jail Administration and Clermont Municipal Probation
- ▶ Family Visitation via Zoom
- ▶ Updated quarantine protocols
- ▶ Ongoing support to staff and clients
